Workshop: Flooding stress tolerance in rice



* <u>Tim Colmer</u> is Professor of Plant & Cell Physiology and a leading researcher on plant stress tolerance (grain crops, forage pastures and native halophytes). Flooding stress research has elucidated anoxia tolerance, root aerenchyma and oxygen transport, and underwater photosynthesis. Salinity stress research has evaluated regulation of tissue ions and organic solutes. Multi-disciplinary research involves PhD students and key collaborators. He is an editor of Annals of Botany and Journal of Experimental Botany, and past-President of the Australian Society of Plant Physiologists. Tim is coordinator of the Master of Agricultural Science at UWA.

* Steven Schilizzi is Associate Professor of Agricultural and Environmental Economics and a leading researcher on market-based instruments, especially competitive tenders, to help government agencies encourage sustainable farming practices. His research includes bio-economic modelling of agriculture and aquaculture systems and how to integrate social equity with economic analysis for balanced policymaking. He has previously led two research projects in Vietnam and is contributing to a new one with ACIAR in 2017. Steven also teaches economic development, energy and climate change economics at UWA and has supervised several

PhD and Master students from Vietnam. Since 2014, he has been running a joint short course with Vietnam National University of Agriculture under the Australian Government's New Colombo Plan.
